Chumash Room (Michael Jackson)

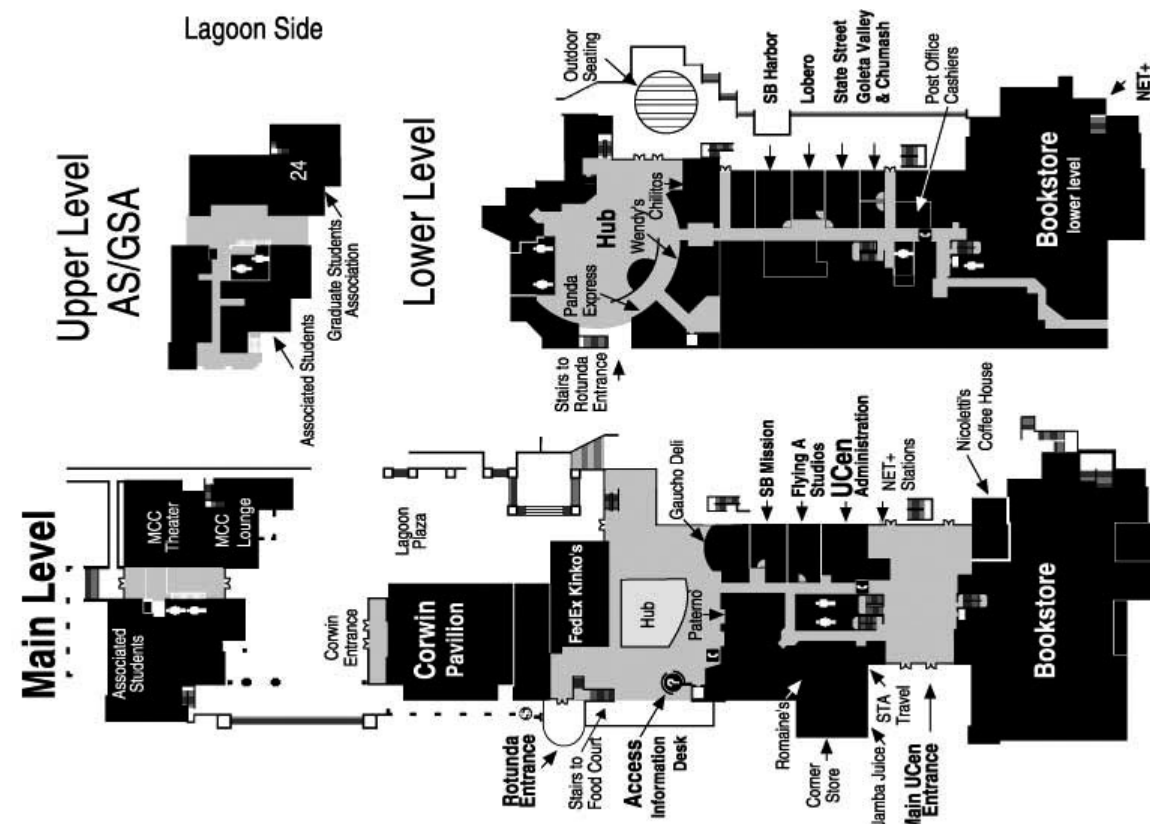
